LICENSING COMMITTEE - 1 JUNE 2010

<u>LICENSING ACT 2003 AND GAMBLING ACT 2005 - APPOINTMENT OF LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEES AND CHAIRMEN OF SUB-COMMITTEES</u>

Recommendation

That Committee appoints five Licensing Sub-Committees together with a Chairman for each Sub-Committee for the ensuing Council year.

- 1. As in previous years and in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005 this Council, as the Licensing Authority, is required to appoint five Sub-Committees to hear applications for licences, variation of licences and applications for review of licences. The Sub-Committees have been set up in such a way as to ensure that licence applications are not considered by Members representing the Ward in question and thereby to avoid any conflict of interests.

CONSULTATION UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003 AND POLICING AND CRIME ACT 2009

Recommendation

To recommend to Cabinet that the consultation be approved.

Reasons why a decision is required

- 1. The Licensing Act 2003 requires that the Licensing Authority publish a Statement of Policy and Principals (The Licensing Policy) and that the policy be reviewed every three years. The policy was last reviewed in 2008 and is due to be reaffirmed not later than December 2010 in order to come into force in January 2011.
- There have been substantial amendments to the Licensing Act 2003 including the adoption of a code of mandatory conditions, the removal of relevant entertainment in respect of sex entertainment venues from the scope of regulated entertainment, and the proposed introduction of Early Morning Alcohol Restriction Orders. There are therefore significant issues that the public, trade and other stakeholders need to be consulted upon prior to the adoption of the revised policy.
- 3. In order to make the most cost effective use of resources it is proposed to combine the consultation on the Licensing Policy and the proposed Policy in respect of Sex Shops, Sex Cinemas and Sex Entertainment Venues. Whilst each policy will be a separate issue there are areas of overlap that need to be considered.
- 4. It is also considered that consultation on the proposed policy in respect of Sex Shops, Sex Cinemas and Sex Entertainment Venues be undertaken in order that a coherent policy is in place prior to any adoption of the revised Schedule 3 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provision) Act 1982.
- 5. It is requested that Cabinet authorise these consultations to be undertaken.

Options available to the Council with assessment of preferred option

- 6. (1) To allow both consultations to be carried out simultaneously.
 - (2) To allow separate consultations to be undertaken.
 - (3) To consult on the Licensing Policy only.
- 7. The Licensing Manager is of the opinion that option 1 above provides the most cost effective method to achieve the ends outlined above.

Information to be considered in taking the decision

- 8. The review of the Licensing Policy is a statutory requirement of the Licensing Act 2003 and must be undertaken.
- 9. The amendments to Schedule 3 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1882 came into force in January 2010 under the provisions of the Policing and Crime Act 2009. The Council is required either to adopt the revised Schedule 3 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 or, should it fail to do so within 12 months, carry out a public consultation as to whether or not it should be adopted. There is therefore no saving in not carrying out the consultation in respect of this issue.
- 10. It is intended to try to mitigate costs by making both policies available online and only providing hard copies to responsible authorities and trade organisations.
