I fail to see why this application is necessary, as the pub already has a beer garden! Surely that is enough outside space?



Dear Sir/ Madam

I would like to object to the application you have received from The Walmer Castle Public House, 4 South Street, Deal, CT14 7AW, to place tables & chairs on the public path outside the front of the Walmer Castle Pub.

The reason for my objection is that the council recent widened the pathway on this side of South Street, prior to this with people standing waiting for buses in this area, when walking with my grand children, you would have to carefully step into the road to get past these people queuing for buses.

Since the widening, you no longer have to do this, but by granting permission to place tables and chairs on this pathway, you are going back to square one again, restricting the width of this pathway.

The Walmer Castle has a beer garden, why then do they feel the necessity to place chairs and tables outside?

It will just become an unsightly smoking area, with bus passengers, including elderly and young children, having to inhale secondary smoke, that will obviously drift around this proposed seating area.

The bar at Number 5 South Street next to our property, has a very tiny seating area, therefore I could understand and did not object to their seating application, I think probably the application from the Walmer Castle is almost a copy cat application, because they have outside seating opposite.

The difference is that that side of the street, does not have the bus stops.

Another reason is that the local residents including my son, have to put up the noise up to 3am in the morning, this would be additional noise up to midnight, by encouraging their clients to sit outside, and with alcohol consumed, some people are bound to start shouting outside the street to people they know, which they see walking by.

These are the reasons for my strong objection to this application.

I am not a serial complainer, I ran the Telegraph Public house in Deal for nearly 2 years, a few years ago, so I am not anti pubs.

I hope common sense will be applied when this application is considered.

My family own 3 South Street, my son James is the registered council tax payer there.
