Brief Details of Item:

(Please provide information about the contents of this item and the reason for decision.)

In July 2019 Cabinet approved in principle the Dover Fastrack project (then known as Bus Rapid Transit), provided that the cost falls within the grant of £16.1m awarded by Homes England. Since that time the Council has worked with Kent County Council using the first tranche of £2m non-returnable funding to develop detailed designs and prepare an application for planning consent. An option to access much of the land required was secured before the project began, but securing access to the necessary land north of the A2 has proved to be more complicated. In November 2019, Cabinet authorised the Strategic Director (Operations and Commercial), in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Transport and Licensing, to explore options regarding compulsory purchase to secure the land north of the A2 necessary to deliver the project. This report will provide an update on project progress including the negotiations to secure land and the impact of Covid-19 on project progress, as well as setting out options for proceeding to the delivery phase.
