Brief Details of Item:

Local authorities have powers to make Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) to address activities carried out in public spaces which have a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality. PSPOs run for 3 years unless extended and/or varied. Variations can increase or reduce controls and add new requirements.

There are currently two PSPOs in place in the district. One relating to dogs and the other relating to alcohol consumption in public places.

The proposal is to merge the current PSPOs whilst retaining the existing controls and, pending consultation, to consider additional elements covering other forms of anti-social behaviour in the District.

Deadline for Item:

There is a statutory requirement to go out to public consultation when making/varying a PSPO. If permission to consult is granted, the aim is to do so over a period of at least 2 weeks before coming back to Cabinet with the results with a view of putting the new PSPO into place in July 2021.
